

2. Oppressed.
3. Seeking.

Answers

- 1.** - #3 In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.
- 2.** - #3 And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good.

3. – #2 James 1:17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.
4. – #1 And the Lord said, it is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him.
5. – #1 Wives, submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church: and He is the savior of the body.
6. – #2 Then the Lord took the man and put him in the garden if Eden to tend and guard and keep it.
7. – #2 For we are labourers together with God: Ye are God's husbandry, [garden, vineyard and field], Ye are God's building.
8. – #2 . . . , she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat. And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they were naked;
9. – #3 And he saith unto him, friend, how camest thou in hither not having a wedding garment?
10. – #1 But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfill the lusts thereof.
11. – #3 And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be **desired** to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat,. . .
12. – #2 Among whom also we all had our conversations in times past in the lust of our flesh, fulfilling the **desires of the flesh and of the mind**; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others.
13. – #2 Unto the woman he said, I will **greatly multiply thy sorrow** and thy conception in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and **he shall rule over thee**. And unto Adam He said, because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, thou shalt not eat of it: **cursed is the ground** for thy sake; **in sorrow** shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life; **thorns also and thistles** shall it bring forth to thee; and **thou shalt eat the herb of the field**; **in the sweat of thy face** shalt thou eat bread, **till thou return unto the ground**;. . .

14. – #3 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

15. – #3 . . . the woman said, **the serpent beguiled me**, and I did eat. And unto Adam He said, because thou hast **hearkened unto the voice of thy wife**, and has eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, thou shalt not eat of it:

16. – #1 . . . and He shall give you another comforter, that He may abide with you forever; even the Sprit of Truth;

17. – #2 Unto the woman he said, I will **greatly multiply thy sorrow** and thy conception in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and **he shall rule over thee**. And unto Adam He said, because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, thou shalt not eat of it: **cursed is the ground** for thy sake; **in sorrow** shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life; **thorns also and thistles** shall it bring forth to thee; and **thou shalt eat the herb of the field**; **in the sweat of thy face** shalt thou eat bread, **till thou return unto the ground**; . . .

18. – #3 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new, and all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, . . .

19. – #1 If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted? And if thou doest not well, sin lieth at the door. And unto thee shall be his desire, and thou shalt rule over him.

20. – #3 For if by one man's offense death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.

21. – #2 For we will destroy this place, because the cry of them is waxen great before the face of the Lord;

22. – #3 And he said, lay not thine hand upon the lad, neither do thou any thing unto him: for now I know that thou fearest God, seeing thou hast not withheld thy son, thine only son from me.

23. – #2 And said, by myself have I sworn, saith the Lord, for because thou hast done this thing, and hast not withheld thy son, thine only

son: that in blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy seed as the stars of the heaven, and as the sand which is upon the sea shore; and thy seed shall possess the gate of his enemies; and in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed; because thou hast obeyed my voice.

24. – #1 And Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah to wife, . . . and Isaac entreated the Lord for his wife, because she was barren: and the Lord was entreated of him, and Rebekah his wife conceived. . . . and Isaac was threescore years old when she bare them.

25. – #1 There was a man named Zacharias. . . and they were both righteous before God, . . . and they had no child . . . and they were both well stricken in years. . . . Vs 13 But the angel said unto him, fear not, Zacharias: for thy prayer is heard; and thy wife Elisabeth shall bear thee a son . . .

26. – #1 And there was a famine in the land, . . . and Isaac went unto Abimelech King of the Philistines unto Gerar. And the Lord appeared unto him, and said, go not down into Egypt; dwell in the land which I shall tell thee of: sojourn in this land, and I will be with thee, and will bless thee; . . . then Isaac sowed in that land, and received in the same year an hundredfold:

27. – #2 But this I say, he which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully.

28. – #2 And it came to pass from the time that he had made him overseer in his house, and over all that he had, that the Lord blessed the Egyptian's house for Joseph's sake; and the blessings of the Lord was upon all that he had in house, and in the field.

29. – #3 And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work:

30. – #3 And God sent me before you to preserve you a posterity in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance.

31. – #1 But the midwives feared God, and did not as the King of Egypt commanded them, but saved the men children alive.

32. – #3 And the Lord said, I have surely seen the affliction of My people which are in Egypt, and have heard their cry by reason of their

taskmasters: for I know their sorrow; and I am come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land unto a good land . . .

33. – #1 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

34. – #1 For since I came to Pharaoh to speak in thy name, he hath done evil to this people; neither hast thou delivered thy people at all.

35. – #1 Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: but rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy.

36. – #2 . . . But they hearkened not unto Moses for anguish of spirit and for cruel bondage.

37. – #1 That you put off concerning the former conversation the old man which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts;

38. – #3 Only in the land of Goshen, where the children of Israel were, was there no hail.

39. – #3 And there came out of the smoke locusts upon the earth: and unto them was given power, as the scorpions of the earth have power. And it was commanded them that they should not hurt the grass of the earth, neither any green thing, neither any tree; but only those men which have not the seal of God in their foreheads.

40. – #1 They saw not one another, neither rose any from his place for three days: but all the children of Israel had light in their dwellings.

41. – #3 And ye shall take a bunch of hyssop, and dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and strike the lintel and the two side posts with the blood that is in the basin; and none of you shall go out at the door of his house until the morning. For the Lord will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when he seeth the blood upon the lintel, and on the two side posts, the Lord will pass over the door, and will not suffer the destroyer to come in unto your houses to smite you.

42. – #2 Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered in once into the Holy place, having obtained eternal

redemption for us.

43. – #3 And the Lord said unto Moses and Aaron, this is the ordinance of the Passover: there shall no stranger eat thereof: but every man's servant that is bought for money, when thou hast circumcised him, then shall he eat thereof.

44. – #1 In whom also ye are circumcised with the circumcision made without hands, in putting off the body of the sins of the flesh by the circumcision of Christ: buried with him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with him through the faith of the operation of God, who hath raised him from the dead.

45. – #1 And it came to pass, when Pharaoh had let the people go, that God led them not through the way of the land of the Philistines, although that was near; for God said, lest peradventure the people repent when they see war, and they return to Egypt.

46. – #2 But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the Word, and anon with joy receiveth it; yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended. Read also Eph. 6:11–18, Hebrews 12:1–4

47. – #2 And Moses said unto the people, fear ye not, stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord, which he will show to you to day: for the Egyptians whom ye have seen to day, ye shall see them again no more for ever.

48. – #3 Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

49. – #3 And the Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord,. . .

50. – #1 And great fear came upon all the church, and upon as many as heard these things.

51. – #1 Vs 11 Now I know that the Lord is greater than all gods: for in the thing wherein they dealt proudly he was above them.

52. – #2 Vs 19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

53. – #3 Now therefore, if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people:

54. – #1 Thou shalt have no other gods before me.

55. – #2 Amplified Version says: You shall not use or repeat the name of the Lord your God in vain [that is, lightly or frivolously, in false affirmations or profanely]; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.

56. – #2 Honor your father and your mother: that your days may be long upon the land which the Lord your God gives you.

57. – #1 Amplified Version footnote explains.

58. – #3 And Moses said unto the people, fear not: for God is come to prove you, and that his fear may be before your faces, that ye sin not.

59. – #1 . . . and make no mention of the name of other gods, neither let it be heard out of thy mouth.

60. – #3 Thou shalt not bow down to other gods, nor serve them, nor do after their works: but thou shalt utterly overthrow them, and quite break down their images, and ye shall serve the Lord you God, and he shall bless thy bread, and thy water . . .

61. – #1 But if thou shalt indeed obey his voice, and do all that I speak; then I will be an enemy unto thine enemies, and an adversary unto thine adversaries. . . . I will take sickness away from the midst of thee. There shall nothing cast their young, nor be barren, in thy land: the number of thy days I will fulfill.

62. – #3 Thou shalt make no covenant with them, nor with their gods. They shall not dwell in the land, lest they make thee sin against me: for if thou serve their gods, it will be a snare unto thee.

63. – #1 Vs 9,10 And the Lord said unto Moses, I have seen this people, and, behold, it is a stiffnecked people: now therefore let me alone, that my wrath may wax hot against them, and that I may consume them: . . .

64. – #2 And Moses besought the Lord, why doth thy wrath wax hot against thy people, . . . Wherefore should the Egyptians speak, and say, . . . Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, thy servants, to whom thou swarest by thine own self, and saidst unto them . . . And the Lord relented of the evil which he thought to do unto His people.

65. – #3 And the Lord said unto Moses, whosoever hath sinned

against me, him will I blot out of my book.

66. – #2 For wherein shall it be known here that I and thy people have found grace in thy sight? Is it not in that thou goest with us? . . .

67. – #2 Take heed to thyself, lest thou make a covenant with the inhabitants of the land whither thou goest, lest it be for a snare in the midst of thee:

68. – #3 Or what king, going to make war against another (the inhabitants of the land) king, sitteth not down first, and consulteth whether he be able with ten thousand to meet him that cometh against him with twenty thousand? Or else, while the other is yet a great way off, he sendeth an ambassage. and desireth conditions of peace. So likewise, whosoever, he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple.

69. – #1 And thou shalt put upon Aaron the Holy garments, and anoint him, and sanctify him; that he may minister unto me in the priest's office. (Christians should apply this spiritually. The NT tells us what to put off and what to put on.)

70. – #2 But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfill the lusts thereof.

71. – #3 And if a soul sin, and hear the voice of swearing, and is a witness, whether he hath seen or known of it, if he do not utter it, then he shall bear his iniquity.

72. – #2 And that you may put difference between holy and unholy, and between unclean and clean;

73. – #1 Ye shall therefore keep all my statutes, and all my judgments, and do them: that the land, whither I bring you to dwell therein, spue you not out.

74. – #2 That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

75. – #1 And ye shall chase your enemies, and they shall fall before you by the sword.

76. – #3 But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take though for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.

77. – #3 And I will set my tabernacle among you: and my soul shall not abhor you. And I will walk among you, and will be your God, and ye shall be my people.

78. – #2 Vs 11 And Moses said unto the Lord . . .

79. – #3 And the Lord said unto Moses, is the Lord's hand waxed short? Thou shalt see now whether my word shall come to pass unto thee or not.

80. – #1 Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.

81. – #1 (Now the man Moses was very meek, above all the men which were upon the face of the earth.)

82. – #2 Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.

83. – #3 My servant Moses is not so, who is faithful in all mine house. With him will I speak mouth to mouth even apparently, and not in dark speeches; . . .

84. – #3 With him will I speak mouth to mouth, even apparently, and not in dark speeches; and the similitude of the Lord shall he behold: wherefore then were ye not afraid to speak against my servant Moses.

85. – #2 And the Lord said unto Moses, if her father had but spit in her face, should she not be ashamed seven days? Let her be shut out from the camp seven days, and after that let her be received in again.

86. – #1 And they came unto the brook of Eshcol, and cut down from thence a branch with one cluster of grapes, and they bare it between two upon a staff; . .

87. – #1 For all the promises of God in him are yea, and in him amen, unto the glory of God by us.

88. – #3 And there we saw the giants, the sons of Anak, which come of the giants: and we were in our own sight as grasshoppers, and so we were in their sight.

89. – #2 For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.

90. – #1 Because all those men which have seen my glory, and my miracles, which I did in Egypt and in the wilderness, and have tempted me now these ten times, and have not hearkened to my

voice; surely they shall not see the land which I sware unto their fathers, neither shall any of them that provoked me see it: but my servant Caleb, because he had another spirit with him, and hath followed me fully, him will I bring into the land whereinto he went; and his seed shall possess it.

91. – #2 But my servant Caleb, because he had another spirit with him, and hath followed me fully, him will I bring into the land. . .

92. – #2 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws into their mind, and write them in their hears: and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people:

93. – #3 But as truly as I live, all the earth shall be filled with the glory of the Lord.

94. – #1 And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be one, even as we are one:

95. – #3 Say unto them, as truly as I live, saith the Lord, as ye have spoken in mine ears, so will I do to you: your carcasses shall fall in this wilderness; and all that were numbered of you, according to your whole number, from twenty years old and upward, which have murmured against me, doubtless ye shall not come into the land, concerning which I sware to . . .

96. – #1 but I say unto you, that every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the in the day of judgment. For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.

97. – #1 And the men, which Moses sent to search the land, who returned, and made all the congregation to murmur against him, by bringing up a slander upon the land,

98. – #2 Go not up, for the Lord is not among you; that ye be not smitten before your enemies.

99. – #3 . . . , and ye shall fall by the sword: because ye are turned away from the Lord, therefore the Lord will not be with you.

100. – #2 Little children, keep yourselves from idols.

101. – #1 One ordinance shall be both for you of the congregation, and also for the stranger that sojourneth with you, an ordinance for

ever in your generations: as ye are, so shall the stranger be before the Lord.

102. – #1 Acts 5:13 And of the rest durst no man join himself to them: but the people magnified them.

103. – #1 And the clean person shall sprinkle upon the unclean on the third day, and the seventh day: and on the seventh day he shall purify himself, and wash his clothes, and bathe himself in water (water of separation, Vs 20, in Amplified Bible, water of purification), and shall be clean at even.

104. – #2 That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the Word, . . .

105. – #2 Sanctify them through the truth: thy word is truth.

Ephesians 5:26 That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word,

106. – #3 Psalm 106:33 Because they provoked his spirit, so that he spake unadvisedly with his lips.

107. – #1 For they that are after the flesh do mind the things of the flesh; but they that are after the Spirit the things of the Spirit.

108. – #1 Vs 6 And the Lord sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people; and much people of Israel died.

109. – #3 2:14 Do all things without murmurings and disputings: (Amplified Version has 'against God' her in brackets)

110. – #3 And the Lord said unto Moses, make thee a fiery serpent, and set it upon a pole: and it shall come to pass, that every one that is bitten, when he looketh upon it, shall live.

111. – #2 And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life.

112. – #3 Behold, I have received commandment to bless: and he hath blessed; and I cannot reverse it. He hath not beheld iniquity in Jacob, neither hath he seen perverseness in Israel: the Lord his God is with him, . . .

113. – #1 Then ye shall drive out all the inhabitants of the land from before you, and destroy all their pictures, and destroy all their molten images, and quite pluck down all their high places: . . . But if ye will

not drive out the inhabitants of the land from before you; then it shall come to pass, that those which ye let remain of them shall be pricks in your eyes, and thorns in your sides, and shall vex you in the land wherein ye dwell.

114. – #2 Now these things were for examples, to the intent we should not . . . [in this case we should not hang on to any of our previous way to thinking and doing, but we should drive out carnal thinking and renew our mind with the word of God.]

115. – #3 Then I said unto you, dread not, neither be afraid of them. The Lord your God which goeth before you, he shall fight for you, according to all that he did for you in Egypt before your eyes;

116. – #1 Then ye answered and said unto me, we have sinned against the Lord, we will go up and fight, according to all that the Lord our God commanded us, and when ye had girded on every man his weapons of war, ye were ready to go up into the hill. And the Lord said unto me, say unto them, go not up, neither fight; for I am not among you; lest ye be smitten before your enemies.

117. – #3 But ye that did cleave unto the Lord your God are alive every one of you this day.

118. – #1 Behold, I have taught you statutes and judgments, even as the Lord my God commanded me, that ye should do so in the land whither ye go to possess it. Keep therefore and do them; for this is your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the nations, . . .

119. – #3 Take heed unto yourselves, lest ye forget the covenant of the Lord your God, which he made with you, and make you a graven image, or the likeness of any thing which the Lord thy God hath forbidden thee. For the Lord thy God is a consuming fire, even a jealous God.

120. – #2 But if from thence thou shalt seek the Lord thy God, thou shalt find him, if thou seek him with all thy heart and with all thy soul.

121. – #3 Know therefore this day, and consider it in thine heart, that the Lord he is God in heaven above, and upon the earth beneath: there is none else. Thou shalt keep therefore his statutes, and his commandments, which I command thee this day, that it may go well with thee, and

with thy children after thee.

122. – #1 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.

123. – #3 And these words which I command you this day, shall be in thine heart: and thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.

124. – #1 And when the Lord thy God shall deliver them before thee; thou shalt smite them, and utterly destroy them; thou shalt make no covenant with them, nor show mercy unto them: . . . For they will turn away thy son from following me, that they may serve other gods:

125. – #2 Know therefore that the Lord thy God, he is God, the faithful God, which keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love him and keep his commandments to a thousand generations;

126. – #3 Lest when thou hast eaten and are full, and hast built goodly houses, and dwelt therein; . . . then thine heart be lifted up, and thou forget the Lord thy God, which brought thee forth out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage; . . . (led thee, protected thee, fed thee, humbled thee) and say in thine heart, my power and the might of mine hand hath gotten me this wealth.

127. – #1 And it shall be, if thou do at all forget the Lord thy God, and walk after other gods, and serve them, and worship them, I testify against you this day that ye shall surely perish.

128. – #2 And now Israel, what doth the Lord thy God require of thee, but to fear the Lord thy God, to walk in all his ways, and to love him, and to serve the Lord thy God wit all thy heart and with all thy soul,

129. – #3 But your eyes have seen all the great acts of the Lord which he did. Therefore shall ye keep all the commandments . . .

130. – #1 Therefore shall ye keep all the commandments which I command you this day, that ye may be strong, and go in and possess the land,. . .

131. – #2 And it shall come to pass, if ye shall hearken diligently unto my commandments which I command you this day, to love the Lord your God, and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul,

that I will give you the rain of your land in his due season, the first rain and the latter rain . . .

132. – #3 Take heed to yourselves, that your heart be not deceived, and ye turn aside, and serve other gods and worship them.

133. – #1 Therefore shall ye lay up these my words in your heart and in your soul, and bind them for a sign upon your hand, that they may be as frontlets between your eyes . . .

134. – #3 And ye shall teach them your children, speaking of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt write them upon the door posts of thine house, and upon thy gates: .

135. – #3 That your days may be multiplied, and the days of your children, in the land which the Lord sware unto your Fathers to give them, . . .

136. – #1 Ye shall utterly destroy all the places, wherein the nations which ye shall possess served their gods, . . . Vs 3 And ye shall overthrow their alters, and break their pillars, and burn their groves with fire . . .Vs 30 Take heed to yourself that thou be not snared by following them, after that they be destroyed from before thee; and that thou inquire not after their gods, saying, how did these nations serve their gods? Even so will I do likewise.

137. – #1 If there arise among you a prophet, or a dreamer of dreams, and giveth thee a sign or a wonder, and the sign or wonder come to pass, whereof he spake unto thee, saying, let us go after other gods, . . .Thou shalt not hearken unto the words of that prophet, . . . ye shall walk after the Lord your God, and fear him, and keep his commandments. and obey his voice, . . .

138. – #3 And thou shalt remember that thou wast a bondman in Egypt: and thou shalt observe and do these statutes. . . vs 15 . . . Because the Lord thy God shall bless thee in all thine increase, and in all the works of thine hands, therefore thou shalt surely rejoice.

139. – #1 When you art come into the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee, thou shalt not learn to do after the abominations of those nations. There shall not be found among you any one that maketh his son or daughter to pass through the fire, or that useth divination, or an observer of times, or an enchanter, or a witch, or a

charmer, or a consulter with familiar spirits, or a wizard, or a necromancer. For all that do these things are an abomination unto the Lord . . .

140. – #2 The woman shall not wear that which pertaineth unto a man, neither shall a man put on a woman's garment: for all that do so are abomination unto the Lord thy God.

141. – #2 Thou hast avouched the Lord this day to be thy God, and to walk in his ways, and to keep his statutes, and his commandments, and his judgments, and to hearken unto his voice: and the Lord hath avouched thee this day to be his peculiar people, . . . and to make thee high above all nations which he hath made, in praise, and in name, and in honour; and that thou mayest be an holy people unto the Lord thy God, . . .

142. – #1 Deuteronomy 28:1–14

143. – #2 I Corinthians 15:10 But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which he has bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me.

144. – #3 I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live: that thou mayest love the Lord thy God, and that thou mayest obey his voice and that thou mayest cleave unto him: for he is thy life, and the length of thy days that thou mayest dwell in the land which the Lord sware unto thy fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give them.
(Remember, for Christians the promise land is the land of promises and Jesus already obeyed the law and obtained it for us. Our part is to abide in the vine. To hearken unto God. To choose God's way.)

145. – #3 Have I not commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the Lord thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest.

146. – #1 And she said unto the men, I know that the Lord hath given you the land, and that your terror is fallen upon us, and that all the inhabitants of the land faint because of you. For we have heard how the Lord dried up the water of the red sea for you, when ye came out of Egypt; and what ye did unto the two kings of the Amorites, that

were on the other side Jordan, . . .

147. – #2 And Joshua said unto the people, sanctify yourselves: for tomorrow the Lord will do wonders among you.

148. – #3 Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, and will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord almighty. (Hos. 1:10, Isa. 43:6)

149. – #1 . . . for thus saith the Lord God of Israel, there is an accursed thing in the midst of thee, O Israel: thou canst not stand before thine enemies, until ye take away the accursed thing from among you.

150. – #3 Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded.

151. – #3 For Joshua drew not his hand back, wherewith he stretched out the spear, until he had utterly destroyed all the inhabitants of Ai.

152. – #1 Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God that ye may be able to withstand the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

153. – #1 Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God that ye may be able to withstand the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

154. – #1 Now thanks be unto God, which always causeth us to triumph in Christ, and maketh manifest the savour of his knowledge buy us in every place.

155. – #2 And Joshua said unto the children of Israel, How long are ye slack to go to possess the land, which the Lord God of your fathers hath given you?

156. – #2 . . . that ye come not among these nations, these that remain among you; neither make mention of the name of their gods, nor cause to swear by them, neither serve them, nor bow yourselves unto them:

157. – #1 Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, and will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty.

158. – #1 Know for a certainty that the Lord your God will no more

drive out any of these nations from before you' but they shall be snares and traps unto you, and scourges in your sides, and thorns in your eyes, until ye perish from off this good land which the Lord your God hath given you.

159. – #2 And the cares of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts of other things entering in, choke the Word, and it becometh unfruitful.

160. – #2 And ye shall make no league with the inhabitants of this land; ye shall throw down their altars: but ye have not obeyed my voice: why have ye done this? Wherefore I also said, I will not drive them out from before you; but they shall be as thorns in your sides, and their gods shall be a snare unto you.

161. – #1

162. – #1 And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? For ye are the temple of the living God; . . .

163. – #3 2:16 Nevertheless the Lord raised up judges, which delivered them out of the hand of those that spoiled them.

164. – #3

165. – #2 And when the Lord raised them up judges, then the Lord was with the judge, and delivered them out of the hand of their enemies all the days of the judges: for it repented the Lord because of their groanings, by reason of them that oppressed them and vexed them.

166. – #3 And the anger of the Lord was hot against Israel; and he said, because that this people hath transgressed my covenant which I commanded their fathers, and have not hearkened unto my voice; I also will not henceforth drive out any from before them of the nations which Joshua left when he died: that through them I may prove Israel, whether they will keep the way of the Lord to walk therein, as their fathers did keep it, or not.

167. – #1 And I said unto you, I am the Lord your God; fear not the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but ye have not obeyed my voice.

168. – #2 And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul

and body in hell.

169. – #3 And she said, let thine handmaid find grace in thy sight. So the woman went her way, and did eat, and her countenance was no more sad.

170. – #3 When Jesus heard these things, he marveled at him, and turned him about, and said unto the people that followed him, I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel.

171. – #2 Wherefore the Lord God of Israel saith, I said indeed that thy house, and the house of thy father, should walk before me for ever: but now the Lord saith, be it far from me; for them that honour me I will honour, and they that despise me shall be lightly esteemed.

172. – #1 For all the promises of God in him are yea, and in him amen, unto the glory of God by us.

173. – #1 The Spirit of the Lord will come upon thee, and thou shalt prophesy with them, and shalt be turned into another man.

174. – #2 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria and unto the uttermost part of the earth.

175. – #2 And let it be, when these signs are come unto thee, that thou do as occasion serve thee, for God is with thee.

176. – #1 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

177. – #3 It repenteth me that I have set up Saul to be king: for he is turned back from following me, and hath not performed my commandments . . .

178. – #1 And Samuel said, hath the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams.

179. – #2 But be ye doers of the Word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.

180. – #2 But the Lord said unto Samuel, look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the Lord seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward

appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart.

181. – #3 Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, (Amplified says, good character) full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business.

182. – #2 But the Spirit of the Lord departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the Lord troubled him.

183. – #2 When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out. And when he cometh, he findeth it swept and garnished. Then goeth he, and taketh to him seven other spirits more wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: . . .

184. – #1 And David spake to the men that stood by him saying, what shall be done to the man that killeth this Philistine, and taketh away the reproach from Israel: For who is this uncircumcised Philistine, that he should defy the armies of the living God?

185. – #3 According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue:

186. – #1 Then said David to the Philistine, thou comest to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield: but I come to thee in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom thou hast defied. This day will the Lord deliver thee into mine hand; and I will smite thee, and take thine head from thee; and I will give the carcasses of the host of the Philistines this day unto the fowls of the air, and to the wild beasts of the earth; that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel.

187. – #1 When Jesus heard that, he said, this sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby.

188. – #3 This day will the Lord deliver thee into mine hand; and I will smite thee, and take thine head from thee; and I will give the carcasses of the host of the Philistines this day unto the fowls of the air, and to the wild beasts of the earth; that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel.

189. – #2 Vs. 5 And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the

hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, they have their reward.

190. – #3 And it came to pass after this, that David inquired of the Lord, saying, shall I go up into any of the cities of Judah? And the Lord said unto him, go up. And David said, whither shall I go up? And He said, unto Hebron.

191. – #2 Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints;

192. – #1 Howbeit, because by this deed thou hast given great occasion to the enemies of the Lord to blaspheme, the child also that is born unto thee shall surely die.

193. – #2 Let as many servants as are under the yoke count their own masters worthy of all honour, that the name of God and his doctrine be not blasphemed.

194. – #3 . . . he delivered me, because he delighted in me. The Lord regarded me according to my righteousness: according to the cleanness of my hands hath he recompensed me. For I have kept the ways of the Lord, and have not wickedly departed from my God.

195. #1 Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son: in Whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins:

196. – #1 That the Lord may continue his word which he spake concerning me, saying, if thy children take heed to their way, to walk before me in truth with all their heart and with all their soul, there shall not fail thee (said he) a man on the throne of Israel.

197. – #2 And Solomon loved the Lord, walking in the statutes of David his father: only He sacrificed and burnt incense in high places.
11:1 But King Solomon loved many strange women, . . . which the Lord said unto the children of Israel, ye shall not go in to them, neither shall they come in unto you: For surely they will turn away your heart after their gods: Solomon clave unto these in love. Vs 4 For it came to pass, when Solomon was old, that his wives turned away his heart after other gods: and his heart was not perfect with the Lord his God, as was the heart of David his father.

198. – #2 11:6 And Solomon did evil in the sight of the Lord, and went not fully after the Lord, as did David his father.

199. – #3 No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.

200. – #1 4–5 Or those eighteen, upon whom the tower of Siloam fell, and slew them, think ye that they were sinners above all men that dwelt in Jerusalem? I tell you, nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish.

201. – #2 What prayer and supplication so ever be made by any man, by all thy people Israel, . . . and spread forth his hands toward this house, then hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place, and forgive, and do, and give . .

202. – #1 And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us: and if we know that he hear us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of him.

203. – #3 Then hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place, and forgive, and do, and give to every man according to his ways, whose heart thou knowest; . . . That they may fear thee all the days that they live in the land which thou gavest unto our fathers.

204. – #3 And now, Lord, behold their threatenings: and grant unto thy servants, that with all boldness they may speak thy word, by stretching forth thine hand to heal; and that signs and wonders may be done by the name of thy holy child, Jesus.

205. – #1 And if thou wilt walk before me, as David thy father walked, in integrity of heart, and in uprightness, to do according to all that I have commanded thee, and wilt keep my statutes and my judgments: then I will establish the throne of thy kingdom upon Israel for ever, . .

206. – #3 Therefore being a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him, that of the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, he would raise up Christ to sit on his throne; he seeing this before spake of the resurrection of Christ . . .

207. – #1 . . . and this house which I have hallowed for my name, will I cast out of my sight, and Israel shall be a proverb and a byword

among all people: and at this house, which is high, every one that passeth by it shall be astonished, and shall hiss; and they shall say, why hath the Lord done thus unto this land, and to this house? And they shall answer, because they forsook the Lord their God who brought forth their fathers out of the land of Egypt . . .

208. – #3 And rent the kingdom away from the House of David, and gave it thee: and yet thou hast not been as my servant David, who kept my commandments, and who followed me with all his heart . . .

209. – #2 Vs 5 So he went and did according unto the word of the Lord: . . . and the ravens brought him bread and flesh . . . Vs 15 And she went and did according to the saying of Elijah: and she, and he, and her house, did eat many days. And the barrel of meal wasted not, neither did the cruse of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord,

210. – #1 No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.

211. – #3 And the Lord was with him, and he prospered whithersoever he went forth:

212. – #2 Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again.

213. – #1 And like unto him was there no king before him, that turned to the Lord with all his heart, and with all his soul, and with all his might . . .

214. – #3 And said unto them, ye are the chief of the fathers of the Levites: sanctify yourselves, both ye and your brethren, that ye may bring up the ark of the Lord God of Israel unto the place that I have prepared for it. For because ye did it not at the first, the Lord our God made a breach upon us, for that we sought him not after the due order.

215. – #2 By which we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

216. – : #2 Be ye mindful always of his covenant;

217. – #1 And he took the bread, and gave thanks, and brake it, and

gave unto them, saying, this is my body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of me. Likewise also the cup after supper, saying, this cup is the New Testament in my blood, which is shed for you.

218. – #2 And David said, Solomon my son is young and tender, and the house that is to be built for the Lord must be exceeding magnificent, of fame and of glory throughout all countries: I will therefore now make preparation for it. so David prepared abundantly before his death.

219. – #3 What? Know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price:

220. – #1 . . . the house builded for the Lord must be exceeding magnificent, of fame and of glory throughout all countries:

221. – #3 Now set your heart and your soul to seek the Lord your God;

222. – #2 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

223. – #1 If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

224. – #3 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble. Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded. Be afflicted, and mourn, and weep: let your laughter be turned to mourning, and your joy to heaviness. Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up. John 15:7 If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.

225. – #2 Thus the children of Israel were brought under at that time, and the children of Judah prevailed, because they relied upon the Lord God of their fathers.

226. – #2 My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me: and I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand.

227. – #2 And he went out to meet Asa, and said unto him, Hear ye me, Asa, and all Judah and Benjamin; The Lord is with you, while ye be with him; and if ye seek him, he will be found of you;

228. #3 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

229. – #3 Be ye strong therefore, and let not your hands be weak: for your work shall be rewarded.

230. – #1 Wherefore lift up the hands which hang down, and the feeble knees;

231. – #1 . . . for they fell to him out of Israel in abundance, when they saw that the Lord his God was with him.

232. – #2 Were not the Ethiopians and the Lubims a huge host, with very many chariots and horsemen? Yet, because thou didst rely on the Lord, he delivered them into thine hand.

233. – #2 For we walk by faith, not by sight:

234. – #1 For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him.

235. – #3 6:16 For what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? For ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

236. – #1 And Asa in the thirty and ninth year of his reign was diseased in his feet, until his disease was exceeding great: yet in his disease he sought not to the Lord, but to the physicians.

237. – #2 Is any sick among you? Let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord.

238. – #2 And the Lord was with Jehoshaphat, because he walked in the first ways of his father David, and sought not unto Baalim; but sought to the Lord God of his father, and walked in his commandments, and not after the doings of Israel. Therefore the Lord stablished the kingdom in his hand . . .

239. – #3 And they taught in Judah, and had the book of the law of

the Lord with them, and went about throughout all the cities of Judah, and taught the people. And the fear of the Lord fell upon all the kingdoms of the lands that were round about Judah, so that they made no war.

240. – #1 And by the hand of the apostles were many signs and wonders wrought among the people; (and they were all with one accord in Solomon's porch. And of the rest durst no man join himself to them: but the people magnified them.

241. – #2 And he said, I will go out, and be a lying spirit in the mouth of all his prophets.

242. – #1 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are evening wolves. Vs 19 Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them.

243. – #3 And Jehu the son of Hanani the seer went out to meet him, and said to King Jehoshaphat, shouldest thou help the ungodly, and love them that hate the Lord? Wherefore is wrath upon thee . . .

244. – #2 If there comes any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house, neither bid him God speed. for he that biddeth him God speed is a partaker of his evil deeds.

245. – #3 And said to the judges, Take heed what ye do: for ye judge not for man, but for the Lord, who is with you in the judgment. Wherefore now let the fear of the Lord be upon you; take heed and do it: for there is no iniquity with the Lord our God, nor respect of persons, nor taking of gifts.

246. – #1 Judge not according to the appearance, but judge righteous judgment.

247. – #1 Wherefore now let the fear of the Lord be upon you; take heed and do it: for there is no iniquity with the Lord our God, nor respect of persons, nor taking of gifts.

248. – : #3 Then Peter opened his mouth, and said, of a truth I perceive that God is no respecter of persons, but in every nation he that feareth him, and worketh righteousness, is accepted with him.

249. – #2 Ye shall not need to fight in this battle: set yourselves, stand ye still and see the salvation of the Lord with you, O Judah and

Jerusalem: fear not, nor be dismayed; to morrow go out against them: for the Lord will be with you.

250. – #2 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

251. – #3 . . . hear me, o Judah, and inhabitants of Jerusalem; believe in the Lord your God, so shall ye be established; believe his prophets, so shall ye prosper.

252. – #2 Howbeit the high places were not taken away; for as yet the people had not prepared their hearts unto the God of their fathers.

253. – #3 John 5:21 Little children, keep yourselves from idols. Amen.

254. – #2 Yet, he sent prophets to them, to bring them again unto the Lord; and they testify against them: but they would not give ear.

255. – 2 God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, . . .

256. – #1 And Amaziah said to the man of God, but what shall we do for the hundred talents which I have given to the army of Israel? And the man of God answered, the Lord is able to give them much more than this.

257. – #1 Also in Judah the hand of God was to give them one heart to do the commandment of the king and of the princes, by the word of the Lord.

258. – #3 Who was there among all the gods of those nations that my fathers utterly destroyed, that could deliver his people out of mine hand, that you God should be able to deliver you out of mine hand.

259. – #1 In those days Hezekiah was sick to the death, and prayed unto the Lord: and he spake unto him, and he gave him a sign. But Hezekiah rendered not again according to the benefit done unto him: for his heart was lifted up:

260. – #3 Abide in me, and I in you, as the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me. I am the vine, ye are the branches: he that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.

261. – Answer: #2 Now when the adversaries of Judah and Benjamin heard that the children of the captivity builded the temple unto the Lord God of Israel; then they came to Zerubbabel, and to the chief of the fathers, and said unto them, let us build with you: for we seek your God, as ye do; and we do sacrifice unto him since the days of Esarhaddon King of Assur, which brought us up hither. But Zerubbabel, and Jeshur, and the rest of the chief of the fathers of Israel, said unto them, ye have nothing to do with us to build an house unto our God; but we ourselves together will build unto the Lord God . . .

262. – #3 Then I proclaimed a fast there, at the river of Ahava, that we might afflict ourselves before our God, to seek of him a right way for us, and for our little one, and for all our substance.

263. – #2 For they all made us afraid, saying, their hands shall be weakened from the work, that it be not done.

264. – #1 7:3–4 Then Esther the queen answered and said, if I have found favour in thy sight, O king, and if it please the king, let my life be given me at my petition, and my people at my request: for we are sold, I and my people, to be destroyed, to be slain, and to perish. . .

265. – #2 Ephesians 5:25–27 Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church and gave himself for it; that he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, that he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish.

266. – #3 1:4–5 And his sons went and feasted in their houses, every one his day; and sent and called for their three sisters to eat and to drink with them. And it was so, when the days of their feasting were gone about, that Job sent and sanctified them, and rose up early in the morning, and offered burnt offerings according to the number of them all: for Job said, it may be that my sons have sinned, and cursed God in their hearts. Thus did Job continually.

267. – #1 30:26–27 & 31:23 When I looked for good then evil came unto me: and when I waited for light, there came darkness. My bowels boiled, and rested not: the days of affliction prevented me. . . . For destruction from God was a terror to me, . . .

268. – #3 4:12–17 Now a thing was secretly brought to me, and mine

ear received a little thereof. In thoughts from the visions of the night, when deep sleep falleth on men, fear came upon me, and trembling, which made all my bones to shake. Then a spirit passed before my face; the hair of my flesh stood up: it stood still, but I could not discern the form thereof: an image was before mine eyes, there was silence, and I heard a voice, saying, shall mortal man be more just than God? Shall a man be more pure than his maker?

269. – #3 And also against his three friends was his wrath kindled, because they had found no answer, and yet had condemned Job.

270. – #2 Neither is there any daysman betwixt us, that might lay his hand upon us both. Let him take his rod away from me, and let not his fear terrify me: then would I speak, and not fear him; but it is not so with me.

271. – #1 Job 38:1 Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind, and said, Who is this that darkeneth counsel by works without knowledge?

272. – #3 Behold now, I have ordered my cause; I know that I shall be justified.

273. – #1 Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort;

274. – #2

275. – #1 Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night. And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season;

276. – #3 But let all those that put their trust in thee rejoice: let them ever shout for joy, because thou defendest them: Let them also that love thy name be joyful in thee.

277. – #1 The Lord looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God.

278. – #1 But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

279. – #3 All the paths of the Lord are mercy and truth unto such as keep his covenant and his testimonies.

280. – #1 What man is he that feareth the Lord? him shall he teach in the way that he shall choose.

281. – #3 And he said unto them, take heed what ye hear: with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you: and unto you that hear shall more be given.

282. – #3 Trust in the Lord, and do good; so shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed.

283. – #1

284. – #2 Delight thyself also in the Lord; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.

285. – #3 Commit thy way unto the Lord; trust also in him; and he shall bring it to pass.

286. – #2 The Lord knoweth the days of the upright: and their inheritance shall be fore ever. They shall not be ashamed in the evil time: and in the days of famine they shall be satisfied.

287. – #3 Offer unto God thanksgiving; and pay thy vows unto the most high: and call upon me in the day of trouble: I will deliver thee, and thou shalt glorify me.

288. – #2 But, unto the wicked God saith, what hast thou to do to declare my statutes, or that thou shouldest take my covenant in thy mouth? Seeing thou hatest instruction, and castest my words behind thee.

289. – #3 James 1:22 But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.

290. – #3 God be merciful unto us, and bless us; and cause his face to shine upon us: selah. That thy way may be known upon earth, thy saving health among the nations.

291. – #1 John 17:21 That they all may be one, as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me.

292. – #3 And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth. Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word;

293. – #2 Whom have I in heaven but thee? And there is none upon earth that I desire beside thee.

294. – #3 That they might set their hope in God, and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments. And might not be as their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation; a generation that set not their heart aright, and whose spirit was not stedfast with God.

295. – #1 But my people would not hearken to my voice; and Israel would none of me. So I gave them up unto their own heart's lust: and they walked in their own counsels.

296. – # And saying, repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

297. – #2 Oh that my people had hearkened unto me, and Israel had walked in my ways: I should soon have subdued their enemies, and turned my hand against their adversaries. The haters of the Lord should have submitted themselves unto him: but their time should have endured for ever. He should have fed them with the finest of wheat: and with honey out of the rock should I have satisfied thee.

298. – #3 For the Lord God is a Sun and shield: the Lord will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly.

299. – #3 Justice and judgment are the habitation of thy throne: . . .

300. – #3 My covenant will I not break, nor alter the thing that is gone out of my lips.

301. – #1 Because thou hast made the Lord, which is my refuge, even the most High, thy habitation; there shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling.

302. – #2 Because he hath set his love upon me, therefore will I deliver him: I will set him on high, because he hath known my Name.

303. – #3 He shall not be afraid of evil tidings: his heart is fixed, trusting in the Lord.

304. – #1 Let the high praise of God be in their mouth, and a twoedged sword in their hand;

305. – #2 To know wisdom and instruction; to perceive the words of understanding; to receive the instruction of wisdom, justice, and judgment, and equity; to give subtlety to the simple, to the young man knowledge and discretion.

306. – #3 The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction.

307. – #2 Turn ye at my reproof: behold, I will pour out my spirit unto you, I will make known my words unto you.

308. – #3 But wisdom is justified of all her children. Amplified Version says: shown to be true by her children's life, character and deeds.

309. – #1 Therefore shall they eat the fruit of their own way, and be filled with their own devices.

310. – #2 But whoso hearkeneth unto me shall dwell safely, and shall be quiet from fear of evil.

311. – #2 Discretion shall preserve thee, understanding shall keep thee:

312. – #3 My son, forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments: for length of days, and long life, and peace, shall they add to thee.

313. – #1 Trust in the Lord with all thine heart and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

314. – #2 Be not wise in your own eyes: fear the Lord, and depart from evil. It shall be hearth to thy naval, and marrow to thy bones.

315. – #3 Honour the Lord with thy substance, and with the firstfruits of all thine increase: so shall thy barns be filled with plenty, and thy presses shall burst out with new wine.

316. – #1 Happy is the man that finds wisdom, and the man that getteth understanding. For the merchandise of it is better than the merchandise of silver, and the gain thereof than fine gold.

317. – #3 Length of days is in her right hand; and in her left hand riches and honour. Her ways are ways of pleasantness, and all her paths are peace.

318. – #2 My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings. Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart. For they are life unto those that find them, and health to all their flesh.

319. – #3 Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life.

320. – #1 Put away from thee a froward mouth and perverse lips put far from thee. Let thine eyes look right on, and let thine eyelids look

straight before thee. Ponder the path of thy feet, and let all thy ways be established.

321. – #3 With her much speech she caused him to yield, with the flattering of her lips she force him.

322. – #2 Hear; for I will speak of excellent things; and the opening of my lips shall be right things. For my mouth shall speak truth; and wickedness is an abomination to my lips. All the words of my mouth are in righteousness; there is nothing froward or perverse in them.

323. – #2

324. – #1 Whoso loveth instruction loveth knowledge: but he that hateth reproof is brutish.

325. – #3 He that walketh with wise men shall be wise: but a companion of fools shall be destroyed.

326. – #2

327. – #3 A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger.

328. – #3 A wholesome tongue is a tree of life:

329. – #2 the sacrifices of the wicked is an abomination to the Lord:

330. – #1 But the prayer of the upright is His delight.

331. – #2 He that handleth a matter wisely shall find good:

332. – #2 . . . and he that is glad at calamities shall not be unpunished.

333. – #3 . . . but he that repeateth a matter separateth very friends.

334. – #2 He that justifieth the wicked, and he that condemneth the just, even they both are abomination to the Lord.

335. – #1 II Timothy 2:19 Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, the Lord knoweth them that are his, and let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity.

336. – : #2 A fool's mouth is his destruction, and his lips are the snare of his soul.

337. – #1 He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the Lord; and that which he hath given will he pay him again.

338. – #3 Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that thou mayest be wise in thy latter end.

339. – #1 A prudent man forseeth the evil, and hideth himself: but the

simple pass on, and are punished.

340. – #1 Foolishness is bound in the heart of a child; but the rod of correction shall drive it far from him.

341. – #1 Through wisdom is an house builded: and by understanding it is established:

342. – #3 As the bird by wandering, as the swallow by flying, so the curse causeless shall not come.

343. – #2 He that giveth to the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse.

344. – #1 A fool uttereth all his mind: but a wise man keepeth it in till afterwards.

345. – #3 Open thy mouth for the dumb in the cause of all such as are appointed to destruction.

346. – #3 I Peter 1:18,19 Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot . . . vs 23 Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God which liveth and abideth for ever.

347. – 2 So they did eat, and were filled: and they took up of the broken meat that was left seven baskets.

348. – #1 If after the manner of men I have fought with beasts at Ephesus, what advantageth it me, if the dead rise not. Let us eat and drink; for to morrow we die.

349. – #1 Set Me as a seal upon thine heart.

350. – #1 Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts.

351. – : #3 The ox knoweth his owner, and the ass his master's crib: but Israel doth not know, my people doth not consider.

352. – #3 Ah sinful nation, a people laden with iniquity, a seed of evildoers, children that are corrupters: they have forsaken the Lord, . . . Vs 7 Your country is desolate, your cities are burned with fire, your land, strangers devour it in your presence, and it is desolate, as overthrown by strangers.

353. – #2 Why should ye be stricken any more? Ye will revolt more

and more: the whole head is sick, and the whole heart is faint.

354. – #2 To what purpose is the multitude of your sacrifices unto me? saith the Lord: I am full of the burnt offerings of rams, and the fat of fed beast: and I delight not in the blood of bullocks, or of lambs, or of he goats. . . . Vs 17 Learn to do well; seek judgment, relieve the oppressed, judge the fatherless, plead for the widow.

355. – #1 Bring no more vain oblations; incense is an abomination unto me; the new moons and sabbaths, the calling of assemblies, I cannot away with it; it is iniquity, even the solemn meetings.

356. – #2 Wash you, make you clean; put away the evil of your doings from before mine eyes; cease to do evil; learn to do well; seek judgment, relieve the oppressed, judge the fatherless, plead for the widow.

357. – #1 And I will turn my hand upon thee, and purely purge away thy dross, and take away all thy tin: and I will restore thy judges as at the first, and thy counselors as at the beginning: afterwards thou shalt be called, the city of righteousness, the faithful city.

358. – #2 Therefore thou hast forsaken thy people the house of Jacob, because they be replenished from the East, and are soothsayers like the Philistines, and they please themselves in the children of strangers.

359. – #1 Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hat light with darkness?

360. – #3 Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the traditions of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ.

361. – #3

362. – #2 Say to the righteous that it shall be well with them, for they shall eat the fruit of their deeds.

363. – #1 Therefore my people are gone into captivity, because they have no knowledge: and their honourable men are famished, and their multitude dried up with thirst.

364. – #2 Ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give

good things the them that ask him? Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.

365. – #3 Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil, that put darkness for light, and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter! Woe unto them that are wise in their own eyes, and prudent in their own sight! Woe unto them that are mighty to drink wine, and men of strength to mingle strong drinks: which justify the wicked for reward, and take away the righteousness of the righteous from him! Therefore as the fire devoureth the stubble, and the flame consumeth the chaff, so their root shall be as rottenness, and their blossom shall go up as dust: because they have cast away the law of the Lord of host, and despised the word of the Holy One of Israel.

366. – #2 Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall receive his own reward according to his own labour. For we are labourers together with God: . . . as a wise master builder, I have laid the foundation, and another buildeth thereon, but let every man take heed how he buildeth thereupon. For other foundations can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ, now if any man build upon this foundation gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble; every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is.

367. – #3 To the law and to the testimony: if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them.

368. – #3 For the people turneth not unto him that smiteth them, neither do they seek the Lord of Hosts.

369. – #2 and it shall come to pass in that day, that the remnant of Israel, and such as are escaped of the house of Jacob, shall no more again stay upon him that smote them, but shall stay upon the Lord, the Holy One of Israel, in truth.

370. – #3 They shall not hurt nor destroy in all My holy mountain: for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea.

371. – #3 Open the gates, that the righteous nation which keepeth

the truth may enter in.

372. – #1 Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee, because he trusteth in thee.

373. – #2 We have been with child, we have been in pain, we have as it were brought forth wind; we have not wrought any deliverance in the earth;

374. – #1 Wherefore the Lord said, forasmuch as this people draw near me with their mouth, and with their lips do honour me, but have removed their heart far from me, and their fear toward me is taught by the precept of men: therefore, behold, I will work among this people, even a marvelous work and a wonder: for the wisdom of their wise men shall perish and the understanding of their prudent men shall be hid.

375. – #3 Until the Spirit be poured upon us from on high, and the wilderness be a fruitful field, and the fruitful field be counted for a forest. Then judgment shall dwell in the wilderness, and righteousness remain in the fruitful field. And the work of righteousness shall be peace and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance for ever.

376. – #1 For the Lord is our judge, the Lord is our lawgiver, the Lord is our King; he will save us. They tackling are loosed; they could not well strengthen their mast, they could not spread the sail: then is the prey of a great spoil divided; the lame take the prey. And the inhabitant shall not say, I am sick: the people that dwell therein shall be forgiven their iniquity.

377. – #2 For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the Spirit, and rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh.

378. – #1 O Zion, that bringest good tidings, get thee up into the high mountain; O Jerusalem, that bringest good tidings, lift up thy voice with strength; lift it up, be not afraid; say unto the cities of Judah, Behold your God!

379. – #2 But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.

380. – #3 He shall not fail nor be discouraged, till he have set judgment in the earth: and the isles shall wait for his law.

381. – #2 To open the blind eyes, to bring out the prisoners from the prison, and them that sit in darkness out of the prison house.

382. – #2 To give light to them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace.

383. – #2 But this is a people robbed and spoiled; they are all of them snared in holes, and they are hid in prison houses: they are for a prey and none delivereth; for a spoil, and none saith, restore.

384. – 1 When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee: when thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee.

385. – #3 Ye are my witnesses, saith the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I AM he: before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me.

386. – #1 This people have I formed for myself; they shall show forth my praise.

387. – #3 For I will pour water upon him that is thirsty, and floods upon the dry ground: I will pour my Spirit upon thy seed, and my blessing upon thine offspring:

388. –#2 That confirmeth the word of his servant, and performeth the counsel of his messengers; . . .

389. – #3 And they went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following, amen.

390. – #3 Who is among you that feareth the Lord, that obeyeth the voice of his servant, that walketh in darkness, and hath no light? Let him trust in the name of the Lord, and stay upon his God.

391. – #2 Behold, all ye that kindle a fire, that compass yourselves about with sparks: walk in the light of your fire, and in the sparks that ye have kindled. This shall ye have of mine hand; ye shall lie down in sorrow.

392. – #1 Hearken to me, ye that follow after righteousness, ye that seek the Lord: look unto the rock whence ye are hewn, and to the hole of the pit whence ye are digged. Look unto Abraham your

father, and unto Sarah that bare you: for I called him alone, and blessed him, and increased him.

393. – #3 Even as Sara obeyed Abraham, calling him Lord: whose daughters ye are, as long as ye do well, and are not afraid with any amazement.

394. – #2 Depart ye, depart ye, go ye out from thence, touch no unclean thing: . . . Behold, my servant shall deal prudently, he shall be exalted and extolled and be very high.

395. – #2 Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, and will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty.

396. – #1 Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near; let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the Lord, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the Lord. For as the heavens are high then the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. For as the rain comes down . . . but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth bud . . . so shall my word be that goeth forth . . .

397. – #3 . . . every one that keepeth the Sabbath (That's the Sabbath rest spoken about in Hebrews 4) from polluting it, and taketh hold of my covenant. Even them will I bring to my holy mountain, and make them joyful in my house of prayer:

398. – #1 . . . but he that putteth his trust in me shall possess the land, and shall inherit my holy mountain.

399. – #1 In whom also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestinated according to the purpose of him who worketh all things after the counsel of his own will:

400. – #2 For thus saith the high and lofty One who inhabiteth eternity, whose name is holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones.

401. – #1 Yet they seek me daily, and delight to know my ways, as a nation that did righteousness, and forsook not the ordinance of their

God: they ask of me the ordinances of justice; they take delight in approaching to God. Wherefore have we fasted, say they, and thou seest not? Wherefore have we afflicted our soul, and thou takest no knowledge? Behold, in the day of your fast ye find pleasure, and exact all your labours. Behold, ye fast for strife and debate, and to smite with the fist as ye do this day, to make your voice to be heard on high.

402. – #3 10–13 then shall thy light rise in obscurity, and thy darkness be as the noonday: and the Lord shall guide thee continually, and satisfy thy soul in drought, and make fat they bones: and thou shalt be like a watered garden, and like a spring of water, whose waters fail not. And they that shall be of thee shall build the of waste places: thou shalt raise up the foundations of many generations; and thou shalt be called, the repairer of the breach, the restorer of paths to dwell in.

403. – #3 And judgment is turned away backward, and justice standeth afar off: for truth is fallen in the street, and equity cannot enter. Yea, truth faileth; and he that departeth from evil maketh himself a prey: and the Lord saw it, and it displeased him that there was no judgment. And he saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor: therefore his arm brought salvation unto him; and his righteousness, it sustained him.

404. – #3 And the redeemer shall come to Zion, and unto them that turn from transgression in Jacob, saith the Lord. As for me, this is my covenant with them, saith the Lord; my Spirit that is upon thee, and my words which I have put in thy mouth, shall not depart out of thy mouth, nor out of the mouth of thy seed, . . .

405. – #2 I have spread out my hands all the day unto a rebellious people, which walketh in a way that was not good, after their own thoughts.

406. – #1 . . . but to this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at my word.

407. – #2 For my people have committed two evils; they have forsaken me the fountain of living waters, and have hewed them out cisterns, broken cisterns, that can hold no water.

408. – #1 Turn, O backsliding children, saith the Lord; . . . and I will

give you pastors according to mine heart, which shall feed you with knowledge and understanding.

409. – #3 But I said, how shall I put thee among the children, and give thee a pleasant land, a goodly heritage of the hosts of the nations? And I said, thou shalt call me, my Father; and shalt not turn away from me.

410. – #2 For thus saith the Lord to the men of Judah and Jerusalem, break up your fallow ground, and sow not among thorns. Circumcise yourselves to the Lord . . .

411. – #2 For my people is foolish, they have not known me; they are sottish children, and they have none understanding: they are wise to do evil, but to do good they have no knowledge.

412. – #3 Fear ye not me? saith the Lord: Will ye not tremble at my presence, which have placed the sand for the bound of the sea by a perpetual decree, that it cannot pass it: . . .

413. – #3 Neither say they in their heart, let us now fear the Lord our God, that giveth rain, both the former and the latter, in his season: He reserveth us and appointeth weeks of harvest.

414. – #1 Your iniquities have turned away these things, and your sins have withholden good things from you.

415. – #1 They are waxen fat, they shine, yea, they overpass the deeds of the wicked: They judge not the cause, the cause of the fatherless, yet they prosper; and the right of the needy do they not judge.

416. – #2 To what purpose cometh there to Me incense from Sheba and the sweet cane from a far country? Your burnt offerings are not acceptable, nor your sacrifices sweet unto me.

417. – #1 Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth his will, him he heareth.

418. – #2 O Lord, I know that the way of man is not in himself: It is not in man that walketh to direct his steps.

419. – #3 Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air,. . .

420. – #3 And say thou unto them, thus saith the Lord God of Israel; cursed be the man that obeyeth not the words of this covenant.

421. – #1 Which I commanded your fathers in the day that I brought

them forth out of the land of Egypt, from the iron furnace, saying, obey my voice, and do them, according to all which I command you: so shall ye be my people, and I will be your God: that I may perform the oath which I have sworn unto your fathers, to give them a land flowing with milk and honey, as it is this day.

422. – #2 For all the promises of God in him are yea, and in him amen, unto the glory of God by us.

423. – #3 They say still unto them that despise me, the Lord hath said, ye shall have peace; and they say unto every one that walketh after the imagination of his own heart, no evil shall come upon you. For who hath stood in the counsel of the Lord, and hath perceived and heard his word? Who hath marked his word, and heard it? Behold, a whirlwind of the Lord is gone forth . . . The anger of the Lord shall not return, until he have executed, and till he have performed the thoughts of his heart: in the latter days ye shall consider it perfectly. I have not sent these prophets, yet they ran: I have not spoken to them, yet they prophesied. But if they had stood in my counsel, and had caused my people to hear my words, then they should have turned them from their evil way, and from the evil of their doings.

424. – #1 And I will give them an heart to know me, that I am the Lord: and they shall be my people. and I will be their God: for they shall return unto me with their whole heart.

425. – #1 And it shall be to me a name of joy, a praise and an honour before all the nations of the earth, which shall hear all the good that I do unto them: and they shall fear and tremble for all the goodness and for all the prosperity that I procure unto it.

426. – #3 Behold, I am against thee, O thou most proud, saith the Lord God of Hosts: for thy day is come, the time that I will visit thee.

427. – #1 The ways to Zion do mourn, because none come to the solemn feast: all her gates are desolate: . . .

428. – #2 Her filthiness is in her skirts; she remembereth not her last end, therefore she came down wonderfully:

429. – #1 The prophets have seen vain foolish things for thee: and they have not discovered thine iniquity, to turn away thy captivity; but have seen for thee false burdens and causes of banishment.

430. – #2 O Israel, thy prophets are like the foxes in the deserts. Ye

have not gone up into the gaps, neither made up the hedge for the house of Israel to stand in the battle in the day of the LORD.

431. – #3 Because even because they have seduced my people, saying peace; and there is no peace;

432. – #2 18:24 But when the righteous turneth away from his righteousness, and committeth iniquity, and doeth according to all the abominations that the wicked man doeth, shall he live? All his righteousness that he hath done shall not be mentioned: in his trespass that he hath trespassed, and in his sin that he hath sinned, in them shall he die.

433. – #1 18:27 Again, when the wicked man turneth away from his wickedness that he hath committed, and doeth that which is lawful and right, he shall save his soul alive.

434. – #1 Because with lies ye have made the heart of the righteous sad, whom I have not made sad; and strengthened the hands of the wicked, that he should not return from his wicked way, by promising him life:

435. – #2 Though these three men, Noah, Daniel, and Job, were in it, as I live, saith the Lord God they should deliver neither sons nor daughters; they shall only be delivered, but the land shall be desolate.

436. – #1 . . . and entered into a covenant with thee, saith the Lord God, and thou becamest mine. Then washed I thee with water; yea, I thoroughly washed away thy blood from thee, and I anointed thee with oil. I clothed thee also with broidered work, and shod thee with badger's skin, and I girded thee about with fine linen, and I covered thee with silk. I decked thee also with ornaments,. . .

437. – #2 Have I any pleasure at all that the wicked should die? saith the Lord God: and not that he should return from his ways, and live?

438. – #3 Even so it is not the will of your Father which is in heaven, that one of these little ones should perish.

439. – #3 Then said I unto them, cast ye away every man the abominations of his eyes, and defile not yourselves with the idols of Egypt: I Am the Lord your God.

440. – #3 Son of man, prophesy against the shepherds of Israel, . . . The diseased have ye not strengthened, neither have ye healed that

which was sick, neither have ye bound up that which was broken, neither have ye brought again that which was driven away, neither have ye sought that which was lost;

441. – #2 In that ye have brought into my sanctuary strangers, uncircumcised in heart, and uncircumcised in flesh, to be in my sanctuary, to pollute it, . . .

442. – #1 In whom also ye are circumcised with the circumcision made without hands, in putting off the body of the sins of the flesh by the circumcision of Christ: Buried with him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with him through the faith of the operation of God, who hath raised him from the dead.

443. – #2 And they shall teach my people the difference between the holy and profane, and cause them to discern between the unclean and the clean.

444. – #1 And in the latter time of their kingdom, when the transgressors are come to the full, . . .

445. – #3 . . . a king of fierce countenance, and understanding dark sentences, shall stand up.

446. – #2 . . . and shall destroy wonderfully, and shall prosper. . .

447. – #3 . . . and shall destroy the mighty and the holy people.

448. – #3 And I prayed unto the Lord my God, and made my confession, and said, O Lord, the great and dreadful God, keeping the covenant and mercy to them that love him, and to them that keep his commandments.

449. – #1 Then said he unto me, fear not, Daniel: for from the first day that thou didst set thine heart to understand, and to chasten thyself before thy God, thy words were heard, . . .

450. – #2 and I am come for thy words, but the prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me one and twenty days:

451. – #1 And such as do wickedly against the covenant shall he corrupt by flatteries:

452. – #3 But the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits.

453. – #3 . . . and at that time thy people shall be delivered, every one that shall be found written in the book.

454. – #3 For their mother hath played the harlot: she that conceived them hath done shamefully: for she said, I will go after my lovers, that give me my bread and my water, my wool and my flax, mine oil and my drink.

455. – #3 My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge: because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, . . .

456. – #1 Come, and let us return unto the Lord: . . . after two days he will revive us: in the third day he will raise us up, and we shall live in his sight. Then shall we know, if we follow on to know the Lord: His going forth is prepared as the morning; and he shall come unto us as the rain, as the latter and former rain unto the earth.

457. – #3 For I desire mercy, and not sacrifice; and the knowledge of God more than burnt offerings.

458. – #2 Yet I am the Lord thy God from the land of Egypt, and thou shalt know no God but me: for there is no Savior beside me.

459. – #1 Sanctify ye a fast, call a solemn assembly, gather the elders and all the inhabitants of the land into the house of the Lord your God, and cry unto the Lord,

460. – #2 Yea, the Lord will answer and say unto his people, behold, I will send you corn, and wine, and oil, and ye shall be satisfied therewith: and I will no more make you a reproach among the heathen. Vs 28 And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out My Spirit upon all flesh; . . .

461. – #3 Can two walk together, except they be agreed?

462. – #1 But seek not Bethel, nor enter into Gilgal, . . .

463. – #2 Hear this, O ye that swallow up the needy, even to make the poor of the land to fail, saying, when will the new moon be gone, that we may sell corn? And the Sabbath, that we may set forth wheat, making the Ephah small, and the shekel great, and falsifying the balances by deceit?

464. – #1 And should not I spare Nineveh, that great city, wherein are more than sixscore thousand persons that cannot discern between their right and their left hand; and also much cattle.

465. – #3 O thou that art named the house of Jacob, is the Spirit of the Lord straightened? Are these his doings? Do not my words do

good the him that walketh uprightly?

466. – #1 The women of my people have ye cast out from their pleasant houses; from their children have ye taken away my glory for ever.

467. – #3 But in the last days it shall come to pass, that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established in the top of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and people shall flow unto it. And many nations shall come, and say, come, and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, and to the house of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for the Law shall go forth of Zion, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem.

468. – #1 Shall I count them pure with the wicked balances, and with the bag of deceitful weights?

469. – #1 Who is a God like unto thee, that pardoneth iniquity, and passeth by the transgression of the remnant of his heritage? He retaineth not his anger forever, because he delighteth in mercy.

470. – #2 Behold, his soul which is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by his faith.

471. – #2 For the earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea.

472. – #3 Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flocks shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls: Yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation.

473. – #1 vs. 4 I will also stretch out mine hand upon Judah, and . . . And them that worship the host of heaven upon the housetops; and them that worship and that swear by the Lord, and that swear by Malcham; and them that are turned back from the Lord; and them that have not sought the Lord, nor inquired for him.

474. – #1 Seek ye the Lord, all ye meek of the earth, which have wrought his judgment; seek righteousness, seek meekness: . . .

475. – #2 But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

476. – #3 Her prophets are light and treacherous persons: her priests have polluted the sanctuary, they have done violence to the law.

477. – 3 For then will I turn to the people a pure language, that they may all call upon the name of the Lord, to serve him with one consent.

478. – #3 I will also leave in the midst of thee an afflicted and poor people, and they shall trust in the name of the Lord.

479. – #2 Ye have sown much, and bring in little; ye eat, but ye have not enough; ye drink, but ye are not filled with drink; ye clothe you, but there is none warm; and he that earneth wages earneth wages to put in into a bag with holes. Thus saith the Lord of hosts; consider your ways. Go up to the mountain, and bring wood, and build the house; and I will take pleasure in it, . . .

480. – #1 Then said Haggai, if one that is unclean by a dead body touch any of these, shall it be unclean? And the priest answered and said, it shall be unclean. Then answered Haggai and said, so is this people, and so is this nation before me, saith the Lord; and so is every work of their hands; and that which they off there is unclean.

481. – #1 Jesus' mission was to enable us to walk in God's ways and therefore reap a wonderful harvest. Matthew 7:11–12 If ye then, being evil know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him? Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.

482. – : #1 And he said, this is wickedness. (Amplified version says lawlessness.) And he cast it into the midst of the ephah, and he cast the weight of lead upon the mouth thereof.

483. – #3

484. – #1 Thus speaketh the Lord of hosts, saying, execute true judgment, and show mercy and compassion every man to his brother.

485. – #3 But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace (unmerited love and favor) of God which was with me.

486. – #2 These are the things that ye shall do; speak ye every man the truth to his neighbor; . . .

487. – #2 Who is there even among you that would shut the doors for nought? Neither do ye kindle fire on mine altar for nought. I have no pleasure in you, saith the Lord of hosts, neither will I accept an offering at your hand.

488. – #3 But cursed be the deceiver, which hath in his flock a male, and voweth, and sacrificeth unto the Lord a corrupt thing: for I am a great king, saith the Lord of hosts, and my name is dreadful among the heathen.

489. – #1 Ye have wearied the Lord with your words. Yet ye say, wherein have we wearied him? When ye say, every one that doeth evil is good in the sight of the Lord, and he delighted in them; or, where is the God of judgment?

490. – #2 So they that are in the flesh cannot please God.

491. – #3 But who may abide the day of his coming? And who shall stand when he appeareth? For he is like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap.

492. – #3 Ye have said, It is vain to serve God: and what profit is it that we have kept his ordinance, and that we have walked mournfully before the LORD of hosts?

493. – #1 Then they that feared the Lord spake often one to another: and the Lord hearkened, and heard it, and a book of remembrance was written before him for them that feared the Lord, and that thought upon his name. And they shall be mine, saith the Lord of hosts, in that day when I make up my jewels; and I will spare them, as a man spareth his son that serveth him. Then shall ye return, and discern between the righteous and the wicked, between him that serveth God and him that serveth him not.

New Testament

494. – #3 Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance: and think not to say within yourselves, we have Abraham as our father: [or in Christians case- we believe in Jesus and apply the blood.] . . .

495. – #1 I am the vine, ye are the branches: he that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth good fruit: for without me ye can

do nothing. If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and

men gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned.

496. #3 I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire:

497. – #2 But he answered and said, it is written, man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.

498. – #2 Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

499. – #1 Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.

500. – #3 Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.

501. – #2 Blessed are the merciful for they shall obtain mercy.

502. – #3 Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.

503. – #1 Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

504. – #3 Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for their is the kingdom of heaven.

505. – #2 Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.

506. – #3 Ye are the salt of the earth: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be salted? . . .

507. – #1

508. – #2 Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

509. – #3 Whosoever therefore shall break one of these least commandments, and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the kingdom of heaven: but whosoever shall do and teach them, the same shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

510. – #2 For I say unto you, that except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees , ye shall in no

case enter into the kingdom of heaven.

511. – #2 But I say unto you, that whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire.

512. – #3 Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, thou shalt not commit adultery: but I say unto you, that whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart. And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell.

513. – #1 But I say unto you, love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;

514. – #2 Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.

515. – #3 Vs 5 And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men, verily I say unto you, they have their reward.

516. – #2 But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking.

517. – #1 After this manner therefore pray ye: our Father which art in heaven, . . .

518. – #3 . . . Our Father which art in heaven, hallowed (revered, sacred, honored) be thy name.

519. – #3 Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven.

520. – #3 Give us this day our daily bread.

521. – #2 And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.

522. – #1 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.

523. – #3 Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal:

524. – #2 For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

525. – #3 No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.

526. – #3 Therefore I say unto you, take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for you body, what ye shall put on, is not the life more than meat, and the body more than raiment? Behold the fowls of the air: . . . Your Father feedeth them. . . Consider the lilies. . . Wherefore if God so clothed the grass of the field, . . . shall He not much more clothe you, O ye of little faith. Therefore take no thought, saying, what shall we eat? . . . But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

527. – #1 Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself, sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.

528. – #2 Judge not, that ye be not judged. For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again.

529. – #3 Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine; lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you.

530. – #1 For everyone that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.

531. – #2 Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.

532. – #2

533. – #3 Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name and in thy name have cast out devils? . . . and then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity. Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock: . . .

534. – #1 Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house

upon a rock:

535. – #1 . . . But speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed. For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this man, go, and he goeth; and to another, come, and he cometh; and to my servant, do this, and he doeth it.

536. – #2 When Jesus heard it, he marveled, and said to them that followed, verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel.

537. – #2 When Jesus heard it, he marveled, and said to them that followed, verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. And I say unto you, that many shall come from the east and west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven. But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

538. – #3 And, behold, they brought to him a man sick of the palsy, lying on a bed: and Jesus seeing their faith said unto the sick of the palsy, son, be of good cheer; thy sins be forgiven thee.

539. – #3

540. – #2 But Jesus turned him about, and when he saw her, he said, Daughter, be of good comfort; thy faith hath made thee whole. And the woman was made whole from that hour.

541. – #1 Then touched he their eyes, saying, according to your faith be it unto you.

542. – #2 And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people.

543. – #3 Behold, I send you forth as sheep in the midst of wolves: be ye therefore wise as serpents, and harmless as doves.

544. – #3 It is enough for the disciple that he be as his master . . .

545. – #2 Fear them not therefore: for there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; and hid, that shall not be known.

546. – #1 Think not that I am come to send peace on earth: I came not to send peace, but a sword. For I am come to set a man at variance against his father, and the daughter against her mother, and the daughter in law against her mother in law. And a man's foes shall be

they of his own household.

547. – #3 And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is not worthy of me.

548. – #2 Now when John had heard in the prison the works of Christ, he sent two of his disciples, and said unto him, art thou he that should come, or do we look for another? Jesus answered and said unto them, go and show John again those things which ye do hear and see. The blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the poor have the gospel preached to them.

549. – #3 The son of man came eating and drinking, and they say, behold a man gluttonous, and a winebibber, a friend of publicans and sinners. But wisdom is justified of her children.

550. – #3 Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto you souls.

551. – #1 But if ye had known what this meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice, ye would not have condemned the guiltless. For the Son of man is Lord even of the Sabbath day.

552. – #2 But I say unto you, that every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment.

553. – #2 For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in heaven, the same is my brother, and sister, and mother.

554. – #1 When one heareth the word of the kingdom, and understandeth it not, then cometh the wicked one, and catcheth away that which was shown in his heart. This is he which received seed by the way side. But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it; yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended. He also that received seed among the thorns is he that heareth the word; and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful.

555. – #3 The Son of man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offend, and them which do iniquity;

556. – #1 This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with their lips; but their heart is far from me.

557. – #1 But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.

558. – #2 For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it.

559. – #2 Then came the disciples to Jesus apart, and said, why could not we cast him out? And Jesus said unto them, because of your unbelief: for verily I say unto you, if ye had faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you.

560. – #3 Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting.

561. – #1 But whoso shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea.

562. – #2 And if thine eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: it is better for thee to enter into life with one eye, rather than having two eyes to be cast into hell fire.

563. – #3 Verily I say unto you, whatsoever ye shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever ye loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

563. – #2 And said unto them, it is written, my house shall be called the house of prayer;

565. – #3 And when he saw a fig tree in the way, he came to it, and found nothing thereon, but leaves only, and said unto it, let no fruit grow on thee henceforward for ever. And presently the fig tree withered away.

566. – #2 And he saith unto him, friend, how camest thou in hither not having a wedding garment (the Lord Jesus Christ Romans 13:14)? And he was speechless. Then said the king to the servants, bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many are called, but few are chosen.

567. – #3 Jesus said unto him, thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.

568. – #3 For they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with one of their fingers. (God made a way for us to walk in love.)

569. – #1 But he that is greatest among you shall be your servant.

570. – #1 Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come. But know this, that if the goodman of the house had known in what watch the thief would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to be broken up. Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the son of man cometh.

571. – #2 They that were foolish took their lamps, and took not oil with them:

572. – #3 And cast ye the unprofitable servant into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

573. – #2 Then shall the king say unto them on his right hand, come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world:

574. – #2 Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels.

575. – 3 Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.

576. – #1 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, all power is given unto Me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

577. – #1 . . . Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the Gospel of the kingdom of God, and saying, the time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the Gospel.

578. – #2 And he preached in their synagogues throughout all Galilee, and cast out devils.

579. – #1 And there came a leper to him, beseeching him, and kneeling down to him, and saying unto him, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his

hand, and touched him, and saith unto him, I will; be thou clean.

580. – #3 And when the scribes and Pharisees saw him eat with publicans and sinners, they said unto his disciples, How is it that he eateth and drinketh with publicans and sinners? When Jesus heard it, he saith unto them, They that are whole have no need of The Physician, but they that are sick:

581. – #1 And when he had looked round about on them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts, he saith unto the man, stretch forth thine hand. And he stretched it out: and his hand was restored whole as the other.

582. – #2 And he said unto them, Take heed what ye hear: with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you: and unto you that hear shall more be given.

583. – #3 And he said, so is the kingdom of God, as if a man should cast seed into the ground; and should sleep, and rise night and day, and the seed should spring and grow up, he knoweth not how.

584. – #1 For she said, if I may touch but his clothes, I shall be whole.

585. – #2 And he could there do no mighty work, save that he laid his hands upon a few sick folk, and healed them. And he marveled because of their unbelief. . . .

586. – Answer: #1 and he called unto him the twelve, and began to send them forth by two and two; and gave them power over unclean spirits; and commanded them that they should take nothing for their journey, save a staff only. . .and he said to them in what place soever ye enter into an house, there abide till ye depart from that place . . . and they went out, and preached that men should repent.

587. – #2 And Jesus, when he came out, saw much people, and was moved with compassion toward them, because they were as sheep not having a shepherd: and he began to teach them many things.

588. – #3 He answered and said unto them, well have Esaias prophesied of you hypocrites, as it is written, this people honoureth me with their lips, but their heart is far from me.

589. – #3 But when he had turned about and looked on his disciples,

he rebuked Peter, saying, Get thee behind me, Satan: for thou savourest not the things that be of God, but the things that be of men.

590. – #1 Jesus said unto him if thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth.

591. – #3 Verily I say unto you, whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein.

592. – #1 And Jesus said unto him, Go thy way; thy faith hath made thee whole. And immediately he received his sight, and followed Jesus in the way.

593. – #2

594. – #1

595. – #2 And when Jesus saw that he answered discreetly, he said unto him, thou art not far from the kingdom of God.

596. – #1 For false christs and false prophets shall rise, and shall show signs and wonders, to seduce, if it were possible, even the elect.

597. – #1 And they went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following, amen.

598. – #3 And he shall go before him in the spirit and power of Elias, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just; to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.

599. – #3 That he would grant unto us, that we being delivered out of the hand of our enemies might serve him without fear, in holiness and righteousness before him, all the days of our life.

600. – #1 And when the devil had ended all the temptation, he departed from him for a season.

601. – #3 The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the Gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised,

602. – #1 And he said unto them, I must preach the kingdom of God to other cities also: for therefore am I sent.

603. – #3 And no man putteth new wine into old bottles; else the

new wine will burst the bottles, and be spilled, and the bottles shall perish. But new wine must be put into new bottles; and both are preserved.

604. – #1 Give to every man that asketh of thee; and of him that taketh away thy goods ask them not again.

605. – #2 But love ye your enemies, and do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil.

606. – #1 Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying, this man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner.

607. – #3 But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit with patience.

608. – #2 And he answered and said unto them, my mother and my brethren are these which hear the word of God, and do it.

609. – #1 And they came to him and woke him, saying, Master, Master, we perish. Then he arose and rebuked the wind and the raging of the water: and they ceased, and there was a calm. And he said unto them, Where is your faith? . . .

610. – #2 And he sent them to preach the kingdom of God, and to heal the sick.

611. – #3 Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven.

612. – #2 And, behold, a certain lawyer stood up, and tempted him, saying, Master, what shall I do to inherit eternal life? He said unto him, What is written in the law? How readest thou? And he answering said, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and thy neighbour as thyself. And he said unto him, Thou hast answered right: this do, and thou shalt live. [This does not take away from the Gospel, but it does help clarify it. You must be "born again" to love God and neighbour this way. You must have Jesus in your heart to love God and

neighbour this way. And if you do love God and neighbour this way, you will not do evil (harm}.]

613. – #1 But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had compassion on him.

614. – #3 And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things. But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her.

615. – #3 When a strong man armed keepeth his palace, his goods are in peace: (Ephesians 6– put on the full armor of God)

616. – #1

617. – #2 And it came to pass, as he spake these things, a certain woman of the company lifted up her voice, and said unto him, blessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked. But he said, Yea rather, blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it.

618. – #1 For there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; neither hid, that shall not be known. Therefore whatsoever ye have spoken in darkness shall be heard in the light; and that which ye have spoken in the ear in closets shall be proclaimed upon the housetops.

619. – #1 Are not five sparrows sold for two farthings, and not one of them is forgotten before God? But even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not therefore: ye are of more value than many sparrows.

620. – #3 But rather seek ye the kingdom of God; and all these things shall be added unto you.

621. – #2 Let your loins be girded about, and your lights burning;

622. – #1 And ye yourselves like unto men that wait for their Lord, when he will return from the wedding; that when he cometh and knocketh, they may open unto him immediately.

623. – #2 And Jesus answering said unto them, Suppose ye that these Galileans were sinners above all the Galileans, because they suffered such things? I tell you, nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish.

624. – #2 And, behold, there was a woman which had a spirit of

infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift up herself. And when Jesus saw her, he called her to him, and said unto her, woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity. And he laid his hands on her: and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God. And the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because that Jesus had healed on the Sabbath day, and said unto the people, there are six days in which men ought to work: in them therefore come and be healed, and not on the Sabbath day. The Lord then answered him, and said, thou hypocrite, doth not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or his ass from the stall, and lead him away to watering? And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath day?

625. – #3 Then said one unto him, Lord, are there few that be saved? And he said unto them, Strive to enter in at the straight gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able.

626. – #1 When once the master of the house is risen up, and hath shut to the door, and ye begin to stand without, saying, Lord, Lord, open unto us; and he shall answer and say unto you, I know you not whence ye are: then shall ye begin to say, we have eaten and drunk in thy presence, and thou hast taught in our streets. But He shall say, I tell you, I know you not whence ye are; depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity.

627. – # 3 Behold, your house is left unto you desolate: and verily I say unto you, ye shall not see me, until the time come when ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

628. – #1 If any man come to me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be my disciple.

629. – #2 For which of you, intending to build a tower sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he have sufficient to finish it?

630. – #2 So likewise, whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple.

631. – #1 And when he came to himself, he said, how many hired servants of my father's have bread enough and to spare, and I perish

with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee, . . .

632. – #3 And he arose, and came to his father, but when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him,

633. – #2 It was meet that we should make merry, and be glad: for this thy brother was dead, and is alive again, and was lost, and is found.

634. – #2 And he said unto them, ye are they which justify yourselves before men; but God knoweth your hearts: for that which is highly esteemed among men is abomination in the sight of God.

635. – #2 Take heed to yourselves: if thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, forgive him.

636. – #1 And the apostles said unto the Lord, increase our faith. And the Lord said, if ye had faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye might say unto this sycamine tree, be thou plucked up by the root, and be thou planted in the sea; and it should obey you.

637. – #3 So likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, we are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do.

638. – #3 Neither shall they say, lo here! or, lo there! for, behold, the kingdom of God is within you.

639. – #1 Whosoever shall seek to save his life shall lose it; and whosoever shall lose his life shall preserve it.

640. – #1 And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint;

641. – #3 Vs 5 Yet because this widow troubleth me, I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me.

642. – #2 Vs 13–14 And a Publican standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying God be merciful to me a sinner. I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

643. – #3

644. – #1 Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man.

645. – : #1 Jesus answered and said unto him, verily, verily, I say unto thee, except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.

646. – #3 He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.

647. – #1 And shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation.

648. – #2 But I have greater witness than that of John: for the works which the Father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that the Father hath sent me.

649. – #2 How can ye believe, which receive honour one of another, and seek not the honour that cometh from God only?

650. – #3 Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you: for him hath God the Father sealed.

651. – #2

652. – #1

653. – #3 The world cannot hate you; but me it hateth, because I testify of it, that the works thereof are evil.

654. – #3 If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself.

655. – #1 Judge not according to appearance, but judge righteous judgments.

656. – #3

657. – #3 Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.

658. – #2 Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, if ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; and ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

659. – #1 Jesus answered them, verily, verily, I say unto you,

whosoever comitteth sin is the servant of sin.

660. – #1 I speak that which I have seen with my Father: and ye do that which ye have seen with your father.

661. – #2 Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. . . .

662. – #3 Verily, verily, I say unto you, if a man keep my saying, he shall never see death.

663. – #2 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

664. – #1 My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:

665. – #2 And if any man hear my words, and believe not, I judge him not: for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world. He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day.

666. – #3 A new commandment I give unto you, that ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.

667. – #2 Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me.

668. – #3 If ye love me, keep my commandments. And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another comforter, that he may abide with you for ever;

669. – #1 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

670. – #3 I am the vine, ye are the branches: he that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.

671. – #2 If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments, and abide in his love.

672. – #3 Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you.

673. – #1 These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world.

674. – #3 Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth.

675. – #2 and I have declared unto them thy name, and will declare it: that the love wherewith thou hast loved me may be in them, and I in them.

676. – #2 Pilate therefore said unto him, art thou a king then? Jesus answered, thou sayest that I am a king, to this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth.

677. – #1 And he said unto them, cast the net on the right side of the ship, and ye shall find.

678. – #2 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.

679. – #1 These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren.

680. – #2 And they prayed, and said, Thou, Lord, which knowest the hearts of all men, show whether of these two thou hast chosen.

681. – #3 And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gives them utterance.

682. – #1 And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.

683. – #1 Thou hast made known to me the ways of life; thou shalt make me full of joy with thy countenance.

684. – Thou hast made known to me the ways of life; thou shalt make me full of joy with thy countenance. (facial expression)

685. – #2 Then Peter said unto them, repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

686. – #1 And they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for His name.

687. – #2 But Peter said unto him, thy money perish with thee, because thou hast thought that the gift of God may be purchased with money. Thou hast neither part nor lot in this matter: for thy heart is not right in the sight of God.

688. – #1 And the angel of the Lord spake unto Philip, saying, arise, and go toward the south unto the way that goeth down from Jerusalem.

689. – #2 Then had the churches rest throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria, and were edified; and walking in the fear of the Lord, and in the comfort of the Holy Ghost, were multiplied.

690. – #3 But in every nation he that feareth him, and worketh righteousness, is accepted with him.

691. – #3 How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him.

692. – #2 Who, when he came, and had seen the grace of God, was glad, and exhorted them all, that with purpose of heart they would cleave unto the Lord.

693. – #2 For as the girdle cleaveth to the loins of a man, so have I caused to cleave unto me the whole house of Israel and the whole house of Judah, saith the Lord; that they might be unto me for a people, and for a name, and for a praise, and for a glory: but they would not hear.

694. – #2 And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away.

695. – #3 Confirming the souls of the disciples, and exhorting them to continue in the faith, and that we must through much tribulation enter into the kingdom of God.

696. – #2 Simeon hath declared how God at the first did visit the Gentiles, to take out of them a people for his Name.

697. – #3 And when she was baptized, and her household, she besought us, saying, if ye have judged me to be faithful to the Lord,

come into my house, and abide there.

698. – #1 And when they had laid many stripes upon them, they cast them into prison, charging the jailor to keep them safely. Who, having received such a charge, thrust them into the inner prison, and made their feet fast in the stocks. And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God:

699. – #1 . . . and the prisoners heard them. And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed. And the keeper of the prison awaking out of his sleep, and seeing the prison doors open, he drew out his sword, and would have killed himself, supposing that the prisoners had been fled. But Paul cried with a loud voice, saying, do thyself no harm: for we are all here. Then he called for a light, and sprang in, and came trembling, and fell down before Paul and Silas, and brought them out, and said, Sirs, what must I do to be saved?. . . Vs 36 And the keeper of the prison told them saying to Paul, the magistrates have sent to let you go:

700. – #1 These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so.

701. – #3 And how I kept back nothing that was profitable unto you, but have showed you, and have taught you publicly, and from house to house, testifying both to the Jews, and also to the Greeks, repentance toward God, and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ.

702. - #1 And as he reasoned of righteousness, temperance, and judgment to come, Felix trembled, and answered, go thy way for this time: when I have a convenient season, I will call for thee.

703. – #2 . . . unto whom now I send thee, to open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me.

704. – #2 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness;

705. – #3 Because that, when they knew God, they glorified him not

as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened.

706. – #1 Wherefore God also gave them up to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts, to dishonour their own bodies between themselves: who changed the truth of God into a lie, and worshipped and served the creature more than the creator, who is blessed for ever. Amen. For this cause God gave them up unto vile affections: . . .

707. – #2 And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient.

708. – #2 Who will render to every man according to his deeds:

709. – #2 To them who by patient continuance in well doing seek for glory and honour and immortality, eternal life.

710. – #1 In that day when God shall judge the secrets of men by Jesus Christ according to my Gospel.

711. – #3 But he is a Jew, which is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart, in the spirit, and not in the letter, . . .

712. – #3 There is none that understandeth, there is none that seeketh after God.

713. – #1 They are all gone out of the way, they are together become unprofitable; there is none that doeth good, no, not one.

714. – #2 (As it is written, I have made thee a father of many nations,) before him whom he believed, even God, who quickeneth the dead, and calleth those things which be not as though they were.

715. – #2 And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; and patience, experience and experience hope:

716. – #3 Much more then being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him.

717. – #1 God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?

718. – #2 Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord.

719. – #3 I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.

There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the spirit.

720. – #1 For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh: that the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

721. – #2

722. – #3 For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. Because the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be.

723. – #1 For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live.

724. – #2 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.

725. – #3 For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us. He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely _____ ?

726. – #3

727. – #1 So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

728. – #2 And David saith, let their table be made a snare, and a trap, and a stumbling block, and a recompense unto them:

729. – #2 For the gifts and calling of God are without repentance.

730. – #1

731. – #2 Love worketh no ill to his neighbour: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

732. – #2

733. – #3

734. – #2 Let us not therefore judge one another any more: but judge this rather, that no man put a stumbling block or an occasion to fall in his brother's way.

735. – #3 For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost.

736. – #1 And he that doubteth is damned if he eat, because he eateth not offaith: for whatsoever is not of faith is sin.

737. – #2

738. – #3

739. – #1

740. – #2

741. – #3 Vs 13 Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire: and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is. Vs 15 If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss:

742. – #1

743. – #3 . . . Be not deceived neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkard, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God.

744. – #3 Circumcision is nothing, and uncircumcision is nothing, but the keeping of the commandments of God.

745. – #2 Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.

746. – #1 There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it.

747. – #2 Ye cannot drink the cup of the Lord, and the cup of devils: ye cannot be partakers of the Lord's table, and of the table of devils.

748. – #1 Let no man seek his own, but every man another's wealth.

749. – #3 Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God.

750. – #2 Vs 4 Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up, doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, rejoiceth in the truth; beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. Charity never faileth:

751. – #3 But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more

abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me.

752. – #2 Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners.

753. – #2 Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.

754. – #1 Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort.

755. – #3 For as the sufferings of Christ bound in us, so our consolation also aboundeth by Christ.

756. – #1 Ye also helping together by prayer for us, that for the gift bestowed upon us by the means of many persons thanks may be given by many on our behalf,

757. – #3 For all the promises of God in him are yea, and in him amen, unto the glory of God by us.

758. – #1 Now he which stablisheth us with you in Christ, and hath anointed us, is God;

759. – #3 Who also hath made us able ministers of the New Testament; not of the letter, but of the Spirit: for the letter killeth, but the Spirit giveth life.

760. – #3 In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them.

761. – #2 For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory;

762. – #1 For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

763. – #1 Wherefore we labour, that, whether present or absent, we may be accepted of Him. (Refer to Matthew 7:21–23)

764. – #1 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad. Knowing therefore the terror of the Lord, we persuade men; . . .

765. – #2

766. – #3 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

767. – #2 Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God.

768. – #3 Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, and will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord almighty.

769. – #1 For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death.

770. – #3 But this I say, he which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully.

771. – #2

772. – #1 And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works.

773. – #2 And he said unto me, my grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness, most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

774. – #2 And lest, when I come again, my God will humble me among you, and that I shall bewail many which have sinned already, and have not repented of the uncleanness and fornication and lasciviousness which they have committed.

775. – #2 Who gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God and our Father:

776. – #3 For do I now persuade men, or God? Or do I seek to please men? For if I yet please men, I should not be the servant of Christ.

777. – #2

778. – #1 This only would I learn of you, received ye the Spirit by works of the law, or by the hearing of faith? Are ye so foolish? Having begun in the Spirit, are ye now made perfect by the flesh?

779. – #2 But that no man is justified by the law in the sight of God, it is evident for, the just shall live by faith.

780. – #2 For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus.

781. – #1

782. – #3

783. – #2 This I say then, walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh.

784. – #1

785. – #1

786. – #2

787. – #3

788. – #1

789. – #2 For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the spirit shall of the spirit reap life everlasting.

790. – #3 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.

791. – #2 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.

792. – #1 And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint;

793. – #1 . . . let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; Who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross . . .

794. – #2 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ:

795. – #2 That in the dispensation of the fullness of times he might gather together in one all things in Christ, both which are in heaven, and which are on earth; even in him:

796. – #3 In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the Gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that Holy Spirit of promise, which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory.

797. – #2 That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him:

798. – #2 The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of his power to usward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power,

799. – #3 And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone.

800. – #1

801. – #2

802. – #1 I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called.

803. – #2 With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love;

804. – #3 He that descended is the same also that ascended up far above all heavens, that he might fill all things.

805. – #2

806. – #1 That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; but speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:

807. – #2 Put on the full armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

808. – #2 For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the spirit, and rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh.

810. – #1

811. – #2 I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.

812. – #3 That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God;

813. – #3 Strengthened with all might, according to his glorious

power, unto all patience and long-suffering with joyfulness,

814. – #2 . . . to present you holy and unblameable and unproveable in his sight : if ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the Gospel, which ye have heard, . . .

815. – #1

816. – #1 If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth.

817. – #2

818. – #2 And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him.

819. – #3 . . . labouring fervently for you in prayers, that ye may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God.

820. – #1 And to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, even Jesus, which delivered us from the wrath to come.

821. – #1 For yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night. For when they shall say, peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape.

822. – #2 1Thes:5:5 But ye, brethren, are not in darkness, that that day should overtake you as a thief. Ye are all the children of light, and children of the day: we are not of the night, nor of darkness.

823. – #2 Therefore let us not sleep, as do others: but let us watch and be sober.

824. – #1 Prove all things; hold fast that which is good.

825. – #1

826. – #3 Which is a manifest token of the righteous judgment of God, that ye may be counted worthy of the kingdom of God, for which ye also suffer:

827. – #1 Who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power.

828. – #3 Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition;

829. – #2 Even him, whose coming is after the working of satan with all power and signs and lying wonders, and with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved.

830. – #2 Finally, brethren, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may have free course, and be glorified, even as it is with you.

831. –#1 Now we command you, brethren, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, that ye withdraw yourselves from every brother that walketh disorderly, and not after the tradition which he received of us .

832. – #3 Knowing this, that the law is not made for a righteous man, but for the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and for sinners, for unholy and profane, for murderers of fathers and murderers of mothers, for manslayers, for whoremongers, for them that defile themselves with mankind, for menstealers, for liars, for perjured persons, and if there be any other thing that is contrary to sound doctrine:

833. – #2 Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth.

834. – #2

835. – #1 But refuse profane and old wives' fables, and exercise thyself rather unto godliness.

836. – #2

837. – #1 And withal they learn to be idle, wandering about from house to house; and not only idle, but tattlers also and busybodies, speaking things which they ought not.

838. – #3

839. – #1 But is now made manifest by the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who hath abolished death, and hath brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel:

840. – #2 Hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus.

841. – #2 Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.

842. – #3

843. – #3 Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, the Lord knoweth them that are his, and, let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity.

844. – #2 But in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and of silver, but also of wood and of earth; and some to honour, and some to dishonour. If a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a vessel of honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work.

845. – #1 Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart.

846. – #2 But foolish and unlearned questions avoid, knowing that they do gender strifes.

847. – #2

848. – #2 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, have itching ears; and they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.

849. – #2 But speak thou the things which become sound doctrine: Vs 8 Sound speech, that cannot be condemned;

850. – #2 In all things showing thyself a pattern of good works: in doctrine showing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity, . . .

851. – #1 For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; . .

852. – #3 Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, . . .

853. – #1 Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; therefore God, even thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows.

854. – #2

855. – #2 Wherefore I was grieved with that generation, and said, they do alway err in their heart; and they have not known my ways.

856. – #3

857. – #1 For unto us was the gospel preached, as well as unto them:

but the word preached did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in them that heard it.

858. – 2 Vs 10 For he that is entered into his rest, he also hath ceased from his own works, as God did from his.

859. – #2

860. – #3 Who in the days of his flesh, when he had offered up prayers and supplications with strong crying and tears unto him that was able to save him from death, and was heard in that he feared;

861. – #3 Though he were a Son, yet learned he obedience by the things which he suffered;

862. – #2 And being made perfect, he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him;

863. – #1 For every one that useth milk is unskillful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe.

864. – #3 That ye be not slothful, but followers of them who through faith and patience inherit the promises.

865. – #2

866. – #1 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws into their mind, and write them in their hearts: and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people: and they shall not teach every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying, know the Lord: for all shall know me, from the least to the greatest.

867. – #2

868. – #1 Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us,

869. – #3 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

870. – #2 But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards, and not sons.

871. – #1

872. – #3 My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers

temptations; knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.

873. – #2 If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering, for he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord. A double-minded man is unstable in all his ways.

874. – #2 Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man:

875. – #2

876. – #3 Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death.

877. – #2

878. – #1 Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

879. – #2

880. – #3 For if any be a hearer of the word, and not a doer, he is like unto a man beholding his natural face in a glass: for he beholdeth himself, and goeth his way, and straightway forgetteth what manner of man he was.

881. – #3 If any man among you seem to be religious, and brideth not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain.

882. – #2 Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.

883. – #2 What doth it profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? Can faith save him? If a brother or sister be naked, and destitute of daily food, and one of you say unto them, depart in peace, be ye warmed and filled; notwithstanding ye give them not those things which are needful to the body; what doth it profit? Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone.

884. – #1

885. – #2

886. – #3

887. – #1

888. – #2 And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him.

889. – #1 That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of Gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ.

890. – #1 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.

891. – #2

892. – #3 Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers;

893. – #2

894. – #3

895. – #2 For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:

896. – #1 Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.

897. – #2 Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered.

898. – #2

899. – #1

900. – #3 Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: but rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy.

901. – #3 Wherefore let them that suffer according to the will of God commit the keeping of their souls to him in well doing, as unto a

faithful creator.

902. – #2 Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord,

903. – #1

904. – #2 And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity.

905. – #3 But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins.

906. – #1 But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you who privily shall bring in damnable heresies,

907. – #2 And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of Truth shall be evil spoken of.

908. – #2 But chiefly them that walk after the flesh in the lust of uncleanness, and despise government. Presumptuous are they selfwilled, they are not afraid to speak evil of dignities. Whereas angels, which are greater in power and might, bring not railing accusation against them before the Lord. But these, as natural brute beasts, made to be taken and destroyed, speak evil of the things that they understand not; and shall utterly perish in their own corruption;

909. – #1 For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning. For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them.

910. – #2 But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up.

911. – #2

912. – #1 And hereby we do know that we know him, if we keep his commandments.

913. – #3 But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God perfected: hereby know we that we are in him.

914. – #2

915. – #3

916. – #2 For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world.

917. – #3

918. – #3 Who is a liar but he that denieth that Jesus is the Christ? He is antichrist, that denieth the Father and the Son.

919. – #3 But the anointing which ye have received of him abideth in you, and ye need not that any man teach you: but as the same anointing teacheth you of all things, and is truth, and is no lie, and even as it hath taught you, ye shall abide in him,

920. – #1 Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure.

921. – #3 Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him.

922. – #1

923. – #2 But whoso hath this world's good, and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him, how dwelleth the love of God in him?

924. – #2

925. – #3 And this is his commandment, that we should believe on the name of his Son Jesus Christ, and love one another, as he gave us commandment.

926. – #1 Hereby know ye the spirit of God: every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God.

927. – #2 Hereby know we that we dwell in him, and he in us, because he hath given us of his Spirit.

928. – #2 He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life.

929. – #1 These things have I written unto you that believe on the

name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God.

930. – #3

931. – #2

932. – #2 If there come any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house, neither bid him God speed: for he that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds.

933. – #1

934. – #2 Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints.

935. – #3 And Enoch also, the seventh from Adam, prophesied of these, saying, behold, the Lord cometh with ten thousands of his saints, to execute judgment upon all, and to convince all that are ungodly among them of all their ungodly deeds which they have ungodly committed, and of all their hard speeches which ungodly sinners have spoken against him.

936. – #1

937. – #3 And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever.

938. – #1 Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of His place, except thou repent.

939. – #2 Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life.

940. – #2 But I have a few things against thee, because thou hast there them that hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balac to cast a stumblingblock before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed unto idols, and to commit fornication. So hast thou also them that hold the doctrine of the Nicolaitans, which thing I hate. Repent . .

941. – #1 Notwithstanding I have a few things against thee, because

thou sufferest that woman Jezebel, which calleth herself a prophetess, to teach and to seduce my servants to commit fornication, and to eat things sacrificed unto idols.

942. – #1 . . . and all the churches shall know that I AM he which searcheth the reins and hearts: and I will give unto every one of you according to your works.

943. – #3 Thou hast a few names even in Sardis which have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with me in white: for they are worthy.

944. – #2

945. – #3 I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name.

946. – #1 So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth. Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked.

947. – #2 As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent.

948. – #1 And the rest of the men which were not killed by these plagues yet repented not of the works of their hands, that they should not worship devils, and idols of gold, and silver, and brass and stone, and of wood: which neither can see, nor hear, nor walk: neither repented they of their murders, nor of their sorceries, nor of their fornication, nor of their thefts.

949. – #2 And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth.

950. – #2 And he opened his mouth in blasphemy against God, to blaspheme his name, and his tabernacle, and them that dwell in heaven. And it was given unto him to make war with the saints, and to overcome them: and power was given him over all kindreds, and tongues, and nations.

951. – #3 He that leadeth into captivity shall go into captivity: he that

killeth with the sword must be killed with the sword. Here is the patience and the faith of the saints.

952. – #2 And he doeth great wonders, so that he maketh fire come down from heaven on the earth in the sight of men, and deceiveth them that dwell on the earth by the means of those miracles which he had power to do in the sight of the beast; saying to them that dwell on the earth, that they should make an image to the beast, which had the wound by a sword, and did live.

953. – #1 And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting Gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, and to every nation, and kindred and tongue, and people, saying with a loud voice, fear God, and give glory to him; for the hour of his judgment is come: and worship him that made heaven, and earth, and the sea, and the fountains of waters.

954. – #3 And the third angel followed them, saying with a loud voice, if any man worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand, the same shall drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is poured out without mixture into the cup of his indignation; and he shall be tormented with fire and brimstone in the presence of the holy angels, and in the presence of the lamb: and the smoke of their torment ascendeth up for ever and ever: and they have no rest day nor night, . . .

955. – #3 And upon her forehead was a name written, mystery, Babylon the great, the mother of harlots and abominations of the earth. And I saw the woman drunken with the blood of the saints, and with the blood of the martyrs of Jesus: . . .

956. – #1 And the ten horns which thou sawest are ten kings, which have received no kingdom as yet; but receive power as kings one hour with the beast. These have one mind, and shall give their power and strength unto the beast. These shall make war with the lamb, and the lamb shall overcome them: for he is Lord of lords, and King of kings: and they that are with him are called, the chosen, and faithful.

957. – #2 Vs 2 . . . Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen. . . And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues.

958. – #1 And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine

linen, clean and white: for the fine linen is the righteousness of saints.

959. – #3 And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth judge and make war.

960. – #2

961. – #2

962. – #3 Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city.

963. – #2

964. – #1
